COVENANT

WHAT IS WORSHIP?

Therefore, brothers and sisters, in view of the mercies of God, I urge you to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and pleasing to God; this is your true worship. Do not be conformed to this age, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, so that you may discern what is the good, pleasing, and perfect will of God. ~Romans 12:1-2

Imagine if we all lived our lives in such a way that every person endeavored to bless others, give thanks, give praise, and enjoy fellowship with the Father every moment of their lives. Offering our bodies as a living sacrifice not only brings us closer to God but also brings God closer to others. This is what worship truly is.
